HOLIDAY AUCTION

This event, held in December for the last several years, has been a social event for club members and their guests. Items or services are donated by club members and local businesses that are auctioned off to the highest bidder.

AMERICAN TOBACCO TRAIL CLEANUP

The club members meet monthly to clean a section of the Tobacco trail that runs through Woodcroft and neighboring communities. The women of our club are very focused on keeping our area beautiful and inviting to nature lovers.

YARD SALE
